Scheme length of 4 miles.

Scheme cost includes 30 year maintenance period. 4. The scheme involved an on-line upgrade of the A80 dual carriageway between Mollinsburn and Haggs. The Moodiesburn Bypass section was constructed off-line, to the north of the existing road. 5. South of Junction 4, the motorway features amended "Glasgow" type overhead sign gantries controlled by Traffic Scotland.
